GOVERNANCE PACK - RHINOPLASTY (LOCAL ANAESTHETIC) PATIENT INFORMATION: RHINOPLASTY (LOCAL ANAESTHETIC) Cosmetic Surgery of the Royal Liver Building

WHAT IS RHINOPLASTY?

Rhinoplasty reshapes the nose by modifying bone and cartilage. It may be performed under local anaesthetic in selected cases.

WHO IS SUITABLE?

- Patients seeking cosmetic refinement with realistic expectations.
- Patients with mild functional obstruction suitable for local anaesthetic surgery.

WHO IS NOT SUITABLE?

- BMI >30 without governance approval.
- BP >160/100 mmHg on the day.
- On anticoagulants without GP clearance.
- Untreated BDD or severe psychological concerns.
- Smokers at higher risk of wound issues.

BENEFITS

- Cosmetic improvement (bridge, tip, nostril symmetry).
- Possible breathing improvement.

RISKS

- Bleeding, bruising, swelling.
- Infection.
- Visible scarring.
- Septal perforation (rare).
- Persistent asymmetry.
- Dissatisfaction with cosmetic outcome.
- Altered sensation.
- Rare necrosis of skin.
- Revision may be required.

CLINIC SAFEGUARDS

- BMI/BP thresholds enforced.
- GP clearance required.
- Photography mandatory.
- Zero diazepam policy unless governance approved.
- Follow-up at 24 hours, 4 weeks, 12 months.
- GP informed if approved.

LONG-TERM CONSIDERATIONS

- Results may take months to settle.
- Swelling can persist for 6-12 months.
- Some changes may not be permanent.
